# JESUS

Laid **down** His life


(Luk 23:35, TPT)

One of the criminals hanging on the cross next to Jesus kept ridiculing him, saying, “What kind of Messiah are you? **Save yourself** and save us from this death!””


The default sin


“We deserve to be condemned, for we’re just being repaid for what we’ve done. But this man—he’s done nothing wrong!””

of all time!


