This way I will test them to see whether or not they will follow my instructions. On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather on other days.”

God's provision



And Moses told them, “It is the food the Lord has given you to eat. These are the Lord’s instructions: Each household should gather as much as it needs. Pick up two quarts for each person in your tent.”

The manna stopped the day after they ate this food from the land; there was no longer any manna for the Israelites, but that year they ate the produce of Canaan.

Χρόνος - Khronos

- refers to the objective, measurable passage of time

- The right or opportune moment
- The correct time or season where something significant or transformative can occur
- The divine moment when God makes you seen
